Use speaker notes to add information

Set up for different languages Have beginning, middle, and end

UNDERSTANDABLE

Speak clearly into a microphone
Give people time to process
Use simple language
Describe virtual interaction
On camera speak slowly
Describe visuals in the presentation
Limit text on each slide
Use easy to read font
Keep motion/animation minimal

lest software for accessibility
Use Ethernet connection
Create alternative experiences
Check accessibility as you create
Do a color contrast check
Check materials in greyscale
Check link lengths and adjust
Ask for feedback on materials
